SOUTH COUNTY YOUTH COALITION HIGHLIGHTS

Trilogy Education Fund

Thanks to the dedicated fundraising efforts of Trilogy Service Club at Monarch Dunes in Nipomo, South County Youth Coalition was able to direct \$15,000 to local students in 2023 to support their education, including science camp tuition for Lucia Mar 6th graders. Other aid included college application fees, university enrollment and housing deposits, two \$1,000 scholarships to Lopez High School students, yearbooks, school supplies, technology and more.



Mental Health Support

SCYC was the recipient of a 2-year \$119,000 grant from the SLO County American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA), to help offset the impacts of the COVID-19 pandemic. SCYC saw a great need for mental health support, especially at the elementary level where fewer resources are available. About 30 students participated in 8-week long group sessions, learning coping skills to reduce symptoms of anxiety and depression and increase confidence and positive behaviors.



Parenting Classes

With the support of our partners at First 5, Parent Connection and Lucia Mar School District, SCYC again offered over 100 no cost parenting and parent-child participation classes in 2023. Targeting infants through teenagers, topics included nutrition, imaginative play, fitness, healthy relationships, the adolescent brain, mindfulness, and bonding through art, music and yoga. A selection of classes was offered in Spanish.



South SLO County Womenade

Womenade continues to be a steadfast supporter of the most vulnerable families in our community. Their generous donations to each Family Resource Center in Nipomo, Oceano and Arroyo Grande, Womenade allows us to react quickly to urgent needs and family crises. Womenade also provides nutritious food bags for families.

Holiday Program

SCYC served nearly 300 families during the 2023 holiday season. More than \$13,000 was donated by individuals and organizations. Another 40 community members sponsored a local family in need, fulfilling wish lists for kids and parents. We also distributed incredible donations of toys, personal care items, food and gift cards.






HOW ARE WE FUNDED?


